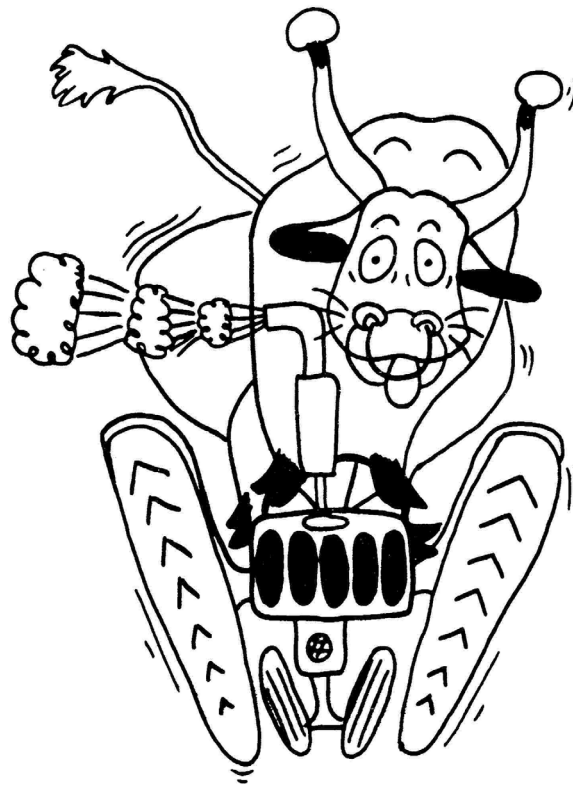

EASTERN SAN DIEGO COUNTY JUNIOR FAIR

RULES FOR THE EASTERN SAN DIEGO COUNTY JUNIOR FAIR ARE ADAPTED FROM THE “STATE RULES AND SCORECARDS FOR CALIFORNIA,” WHERE APPLICABLE.

All exhibitors are expected to help with the dismantling and clean-up of the fair grounds. Please remove livestock and return to help with clean-up. Dismantling cannot proceed until all livestock are removed from grounds.

IN DISTRICT LOCAL RULES

1. Entries are open to San Diego County 4-H/Grange Clubs within the Grossmont Union High School District and Mountain Empire Unified School District attendance areas, and FFA members of Grossmont Union High School District, Mountain Empire Unified School District and Lakeside Middle School.
2. All 4-H/Grange members must be 9 years old by January 1st of the program year (September 1-August 31) or older to show any animal at the Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair, except special Small Animal Primary Classes (See Primary page).

IN DISTRICT ENTRIES

1. All entry forms and trailer reservation forms must be filled out by each exhibitor online from **March 1-31, 2023**. All club/chapter fees to be paid online or postmarked by **April 6, 2023**. Members may pay entries online or clubs may submit ONE club check for all entries including: livestock, home arts and camping trailers. Make check payable to Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair (ESDCJF).
2. **ENTRY FEES MUST BE PAID BY APRIL 6, 2023**. Should entry be made and canceled or not exhibited, entry fee will not be refunded, and penning space will be re-assigned.

3. ENTRIES WILL BE LIMITED AS FOLLOWS: MAXIMUM OF THREE MARKET ANIMALS (EXCLUDING PROSPECTS). Limit two market animals per division. A pen of three poultry is considered as one market entry, i.e. herd, flock or get-of-sire is considered one entry. Exhibitors may be asked to remove breeding stock after day of show if space is limited in barn.
4. Each market animal exhibitor will complete a USDA Wholesome Meat Act Form (In the back of this book) for each market animal weighed in. This form is to be collected by 4-H project/community leaders and FFA advisors from their respective exhibitors and then turned in at the livestock office Sunday, May 14, 2023.

IN DISTRICT EXHIBITS RECEIVED

1. Livestock will be received at fairgrounds May 14, 2023. All exhibits must be in place by 12 PM Sunday, **May 14, 2023**.
NOTE: Swine market animals will weigh-in 7:00am to 12:00pm Sunday **May 14, 2023**. Beef, Sheep and Goats will weigh-in from 10:00am to 12:00pm. Scales will be closed at the discretion of the Livestock Chairman. There will be no re-weighs after leaving scale area. Market animals will be ear-tagged at weigh-in.
2. Market Beef will be brand inspected at the fair. Exhibitors will be notified of the date.
3. Swine skin must not be scaly, excessively sunburned, oily (must be dry to the touch), or have unsightly condition. Swine must be free of parasites and/or eggs.
4. Home Arts Exhibits: All entries will be checked in Friday, **May 12, 2023**, 2:00 to 4:00pm and Saturday, **May 13, 2023**, 9:00am to 12:00pm.
5. Dogs: All dog entries will be checked in 8:00am Saturday, **May 13, 2023**. Show starts at 9:00am. This is a one-day show.
6. Poultry: All Poultry entries will check in at 8:00am, Monday **May 15, 2023**. This is a one-day show.
7. Rabbits/Cavies: All Rabbit/Cavy entries will be checked in at 8:00am, Tuesday, **May 16, 2023**. This is a one-day show.
8. Boer Goats: All Breed Boer Goat entries will be checked in at 8:00am, Tuesday, **May 16, 2023**. This is a one-day show.
9. Pygmy Goats: All Pygmy entries will be checked in at 8:00am, Wednesday, **May 17, 2023**. This is a one-day show.
10. Dairy Goats: All Dairy Goat entries will be checked in at 8:00am, Thursday **May 18, 2023**. This is a one-day show.
11. Large Breeding Animals: All other breeding swine, sheep, dairy cattle, and beef cattle must be on the fairgrounds by 8:00am on the day of their respective show.

IN DISTRICT EXHIBITS RELEASED

1. All exhibits (except one day show animals) must remain on the grounds until 8:00am Sunday, **May 21, 2023**. Prospect and self-haul animals may be released following the awards ceremony on Saturday, **May 20, 2023 after you have obtained a livestock office release form.** Livestock sold through the auction will be hauled at the Fair's discretion.
2. All animals on the fairgrounds after 9:00am Sunday **May 21, 2023**, without any dispersal papers, will become the property of the fair to be dispersed at their discretion.
3. Home Arts Exhibits: Exhibits will be released Saturday, **May 20, 2023**, from 6:00 to 7:30pm and Sunday **May 21, 2023**, from 8:00 to 10:00am.
4. Small Breeding Animals: All rabbits, cavies, pygmy goats, Boer goats, dairy goats must be removed from the fairgrounds at the completion of their respective show.
5. Large Breeding Animals: All breeding swine, sheep, dairy & beef cattle should be removed from the fairgrounds at the completion of their respective show.

OWNERSHIP OF ANIMALS

1. All market animals must have been owned by the exhibitor, in the exhibitors' personal care, & part of a recognized 4-H/FFA/Grange project of the member for a period of at least 120 days for market beef & 60 days for sheep, swine, market goats, prior to the fair & ***must not have been sold as a market animal at a previous fair.*** ***All breeding animals, poultry meat pens, & prospect animals*** must be owned by **March 31, 2023**. Exhibitors must be living in San Diego County for the above stated time.
2. No entry owned by a chapter or club, or conducted as a joint project by two or more individuals, is eligible unless the division or class specifically so states.
3. To exhibit registered animals, the exhibitor must be specifically named as the owner on the registration certificate. When an animal is registered jointly in the names of both a junior exhibitor and a non-junior exhibitor, any eligibility as a Junior Animal will be forfeited if evidence indicates that the animal is not part of a bona fide project being conducted solely by the junior exhibitor.
4. The division chairperson will check breed registration papers the morning of the show.
5. No animal may be entered in more than one class in the Livestock Division unless provided for in the specifications of the class.
6. No animal can be shown as more than one breed.

OUT-OF-DISTRICT RULES & ELILIGIBILITY

1. Entries from out-of-district are eligible in Poultry, Rabbits, Cavies, Pygmy Goats, Dairy Goats, Boer Goats, Dogs, Breeding Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, and Breeding Sheep divisions (excluding Swine). **NO** out-of-district entries will be accepted in Market divisions, or Home Arts divisions.
2. Entries are open to San Diego County 4-H/Grange Clubs and FFA Chapters of San Diego County who are not considered to be in District.
3. All 4-H/Grange members must be 9 years old by January 1st of the program year* or above to show any animal at the Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair, except special Small Animal Primary Classes. (See Primary Division page) *4-H/Grange Program year for San Diego County begins September 1 and ends August 31.

OUT-OF-DISTRICT ENTRIES

1. All entry forms must be filled out by each exhibitor online from **March 1- 31, 2023**. All Club/chapter fees must be paid online or postmarked by **April 6, 2023**. Submit one club check for all entries payable to: ESDCJF.

Entries MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN April 6, 2023. Late Entries will not be accepted.

OUT-OF-DISTRICT EXHIBITS RECEIVED

1. Poultry, Rabbits, Cavies, Dairy, Pygmy & Boer Goats, Breeding Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle & Breeding Sheep will be received on respective show day per **2023** Fair Show & Schedule.
2. Registration papers **must** be presented during these times.
3. See Show Schedule for show dates and times. Classes will be posted during fair week.

OUT-OF-DISTRICT EXHIBITS RELEASED

1. All out-of-district animals should be removed from the fairgrounds at the conclusion of their show.

EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Agricultural, horticultural and all home arts entries must be original work or design by exhibitor completed since **July 1, 2022**.
2. Each animal or entry must be a part of a recognized project of the organization under whose supervision it is developed, at least 60 days before it is exhibited, except in sections which specifically do not require ownership by the exhibitor.
3. Under no circumstances may an exhibitor show the same kind of animals (beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, goats or small animals) in both FFA and 4-H/Grange classes of the Junior Division or in classes for other recognized Junior Organizations.
4. Any exhibitor whose exhibit is liable to cause accidents, injury, or damage to persons encountering such exhibit shall guard and protect their exhibit in such a manner to protect the public from coming into contact with such exhibit. Each exhibitor shall indemnify the Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair and the Fair Board, from and against all claims and demands, costs, charges, and expenses, which it may incur, suffer, pay or be liable for, because of any exhibit not being properly guarded or from injury or damage arising there from. Presentation of an entry form shall be deemed an acknowledgment and acceptance of this rule.
5. Any exhibit not properly cared for may be removed from the fairgrounds & awards revoked at the discretion of the fair or livestock manager.
6. All animals exhibited must be owned or leased, fitted, and properly entered by exhibitors. Breeding animals may be either owned or leased.
7. Any exhibitors found in violation of these rules, the Bylaws of the Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair, or any directives of any Chairperson of any of the Fair Committees, shall be penalized by forfeiture of awards, premiums, and privileges. ***The decision of the Board of the Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair shall be final and binding.*** The Fair Board or Fair Manager shall report, in writing, all such violations to the Division of Fairs and expositions.
8. **No wire/cable halters, or nose rings will be allowed on any cattle at any time.**
9. The Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair allows the use of shampoo and conditioner at the wash rack only. All conditioners must be removed prior to entering the show ring.
10. Grooming: All grooming and care of animals on the fairgrounds during the Fair is to be done **ONLY BY THE EXHIBITORS OR WITH THE HELP OF OTHER CURRENT EXHIBITORS** of the Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair, **not by graduates, leaders, advisors or parents.**
11. No cattle blocking chutes, lamb stands, milking stands, or tack boxes are permitted inside the building area. (There are designated tack and/or grooming areas.) There are no personal pop-ups or temporary shelters of any kind allowed on the fair grounds and in the grooming areas. The grooming area is open to all exhibitors to groom their animals. It is not a space to hang out.
12. All exhibitors are required to wear the official show uniform of their organization while showing the animal for judging, showmanship, and auction. The 4-H/Grange/FFA members will wear white pants, white shirt, tie or scarf and appropriate hat, vest, or jacket. The FFA jacket may be omitted if the white shirt or blouse has the official FFA patch attached to the front of the shirt.

13. Each club or FFA Chapter must provide exhibitors (no parents/leaders) to clean up the pens and aisles of all their club exhibits before 8:00am *each morning* during the fair. Each exhibitor is responsible for feeding, watering his/her own animal. Feed and all necessary tools and equipment should be well marked for identification and must be provided by the exhibitor.
14. Withholding water and/or feed from any animal at the fair is unacceptable. This includes covering the pig litters with a bucket or other device.
15. Shavings will be used by all species in the barn. Wool animals, dairy and beef cattle may bed on straw. **NO BEDDING WILL BE PROVIDED.**
16. **All exhibitors/parents are expected to help with set up and tear down of the fair.**
17. All exhibitors of market animals, dairy & beef cattle there for the week will furnish a sign for each entry. Sign shall include the animal's name, breed, breeder, animal age, animal weight, exhibitor name & club/chapter.
18. No exhibitor, parent or guest will be allowed in the animal and barn area after 9:00pm. Qualified security personnel under the direction of the Livestock Manager will watch all livestock between the hours of 9:00pm and 6:00am.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The management reserves the right to combine any division or class in which the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition or to divide any division or class when entries exceed expectations.
2. The Fair Management has the right to limit entries to facilities available and may limit the number of entries made by an exhibitor.
3. Any exhibit not meeting standards set forth in this book may be barred from the fairgrounds. **All animals MUST BE DEHORNED OR DISBUDED except Boer breeding goats.** Scurs may be allowed at the discretion of the Fair Manager. All male **market** animals must be castrated prior to arriving at the fair.
4. The management shall reserve the right to vacate, as ineligible for competition, and order the removal of any entry, which is not to the best interest of the fair or endangers the public or which has been entered in violation of any rule or regulation.
5. **PREMIUM AWARDS: ALL PREMIUM CHECKS ARE VOID AFTER NINETY (90) DAYS FROM ISSUE.** Premiums will be paid by the number of entries in a class to all livestock breeding classes, which include sheep, cattle, swine, dairy goats, Boer goats, and Pygmy goats. They are as follows:
 - 4 or more entries: \$12.00 for 1st place, \$9.00 for 2nd place, \$6.00 for 3rd place and \$3.00 for 4th place.
 - 3 entries: \$9.00 for 1st place, \$6.00 for 2nd place, and \$3.00 for 3rd place.
 - 2 entries: \$6.00 for 1st place, and \$3.00 for 2nd place.
 - 1 entry: \$3.00 for 1st place.Premiums will be paid for Home Arts as follows: \$12.00 for grand champion, \$9.00 for reserve champion, and \$6.00 for special award.
6. No animals may be brought to the fair that have not been entered by the entry deadline except for offspring of entered nursing mothers.
7. ***No dogs, roping ropes, bicycles, skateboards, scooters, etc. are to be in or around the barn, patio, stadium, arena, dining area, and parking lot.***
8. The fair has a veterinarian visit each morning to tend sick or injured animals. Any livestock illness must be reported to the livestock office.
9. **NO SMOKING, ALCOHOL, GLASS CONTAINERS OR DOGS ALLOWED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS!**
10. Any assistance given to an exhibitor in group or breed classes in the show ring must be given by a current 4-H/Grange or FFA member. Assistant must be in proper show attire in the show ring.

JUDGING

1. THE JUDGE SHALL AWARD FIRST, SECOND OR THIRD PLACE, ETC., ACCORDING TO MERIT. IF WITHOUT MERIT, THE JUDGE SHALL MAKE NO AWARD UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES. THIS RULE APPLIES WHETHER THERE ARE ONE OR MORE ENTRIES IN THE CLASS.
2. The judge shall have the authority to:
 - a. Disqualify or transfer to the correct class any exhibit which does not meet the requirements of the division or class in which it is entered
 - b. Disqualify any exhibit not properly cleaned or fitted
 - c. Disqualify any animal that is in their opinion hazardous to public safety
 - d. Award championships at their discretion for superior animals
3. A Judge's decision is final. Fair management may not request any changes in a Judges' ruling.
4. No person shall be allowed to interfere with the judge(s) during the decision-making.
5. All protests must be presented to the management of the fair in writing within 24 hours of the alleged violation and must be accompanied by a \$100.00 deposit (cash, money order or certified check), which will be returned if the protest is determined to be valid. The Fair's Board of Directors will decide protests. Home Arts protests must be made within 24 hours after opening of exhibit.
6. In any division in which scoring is necessary, the classification points and score cards, as required in the Master Premium List, must be used, and signed by pertinent judge.
7. All animals in registered breeding classes must be registered and recorded with the breed association.
8. DANISH SYSTEM OF JUDGING: In all market and prospect livestock classes, judged under the Danish system, the judge shall place the animals in the proper groups in accordance with the Federal Live Animal Grading Standards.
9. No one will be permitted in the judging ring at the time of judging, except those authorized by the Livestock Committee or Division Chairperson. All ring personnel shall be receive training from the division chairperson prior to the show.
10. Judges are to be commercial and/or knowledgeable professionals in their field, whenever possible.
11. *All judging forms must be completed in permanent ink and signed by the judge and clerk.*

LIMITATION ON AWARDS

1. All signatures and information necessary to determine that the exhibit is eligible must be on the entry form prior to judging. Therefore, it shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor to correct all deficiencies about entries or exhibiting which are required of them by the rules printed in the entry book of the fair. Premiums may not be paid, or awards made, for exhibits in which deficiencies have not been corrected before judging of the class has started.

AUCTION SALE

1. The auction will be held Saturday, **May 20, 2023** at 12:00pm.

2. Weights for auction are recorded at weigh-in day:

<u>Species</u>	<u>Weight Range</u>
Goats:	60 to 120 pounds
Lambs:	100 to 150 pounds
Swine:	210 to 300 pounds
Market Beef:	1000 to 1400 pounds

Top weight is not restricted for market animals of all species. For auction purposes, animals will sell at no more than the maximum weight shown above for the respective species.

3. All animals eligible for sale **MUST** have been shown as individuals in their respective classes.
4. The sale order will be made by having the judges place the animals from the top to the bottom at the time of judging. The Grand and Reserve Champion animals will sell first in their respective divisions. Sale order by species will be decided by the Board of Directors. ***All Grand Champion and Reserve Champion animals must sell.*** Exhibitors may sell only one market animal or one eligible blue-ribbon meat pen through the auction that are not Grand or Reserve Champion. If he/she owns more than one Grand Champion or Reserve Champion, then all Grand Champion and Reserve Champion animals must sell. Exhibitors of Grand and Reserve Champion chicken pens will also be allowed to sell one large animal through the auction.
5. Any eligible market animal not going through the auction must be scratched by the **EXHIBITOR** no later than 1 hour after the conclusion of the market beef show on Wednesday evening. Scratch decisions are to be made and submitted by the exhibitor. Should an exhibitor fail to make his/her scratch by the deadline, the decision will be made by the fair management. ***There will be no animals scratched from the auction once the book has been finalized.***
6. All auction animals going through the sale must be taken through the auction by the owner only. Any exceptions must be submitted to the Livestock Manager ***in writing*** and ***approved prior*** to Saturday.
7. All exhibitors whose animals sell must have a buyer's auction picture taken, take their animals back to their pens following the sale and care for them thru Saturday evening.
8. At 7:00am on Sunday, **May 21, 2023**, all exhibitors of sale animals **MUST** be at their pens or stalls to help take pens down and clean up the fairgrounds.
9. An additional clean up day will begin at 8:00 am on Saturday, **May 27, 2023**.

CAMPGROUND AREA INFORMATION

Campground reservation form in back of entry book.

1. Trailer space fee is \$50.00 for the week. No trailer park refunds will be given for no-shows.
2. Trailer reservations must be submitted with entry fees.
3. Trailers move in on Saturday from 8:00am-5:00pm. All trailers must enter from the Main Rodeo Stadium parking lot on Mapleview Street for parking behind bleachers.
4. **Trailers will be released Sunday at 9 am.** Spaces must be left clean and free of debris and hay. All trash cans must be emptied, and debris must be put into dumpsters.
5. *Supervision for exhibitors staying overnight in the campground must be by an adult (25 years and older) from the same club/chapter staying overnight in the same motor home, trailer, or tent.*
6. *No water from trailers is to be drained onto the ground at any time.*
7. *No hook-ups or utilities are provided.* Each camping unit must be totally self-contained. There are no exceptions. Violators will be asked to remove their trailer from campground and will not be refunded camp fees.
8. No generators will be operated after 10:00pm or before 6:00am.
9. *Trailer Park entries are limited to space available and those exhibitors living 20 miles or further away from the fair. Furthest from fair will have first priority for spaces. Special requests may be considered, by the Fair Manager, in written letter form at entry turn-in only.*
10. Spaces will be assigned by campground coordinator. A map will be posted on move-in day by bathrooms in camp area showing which spaces have been assigned to families by club and chapter.
11. **No El Capitan High School students are allowed in the campground area.**

LIVESTOCK HEALTH RULES

1. Animals showing any evidence of communicable disease or unsightly disease condition shall not be admitted to or remain on the grounds.
2. All health concerns need to be addressed to the Livestock or Fair Manager.
3. Any antibiotic, medication, pesticide, or other substance administered to any animal while at the Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair will be administered after approval of the Fair Manager or Livestock Chairman by or under the *direct* supervision of a licensed veterinarian. Any such medication or treatment may require additional withdrawal time and disqualify the entry from eligibility for sale or shipment to slaughter from the Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair. It is required that USDA Wholesome Meat Act be signed and turned in at weigh-in with one form for each specie for every exhibitor. (Barn Sales included).
4. The management reserves the right to require health inspections and diagnostic tests to be made before or after animals are on the fairgrounds or to inaugurate disease control procedures which may become necessary in emergencies. The further right is reserved by the management to order and cause preemptory removal from the grounds of any animal, which does not in every respect meet the health requirements.
5. Only certificates as prescribed by these rules will be accepted.
6. A screening committee made up of a veterinarian and/or member of a livestock committee will evaluate animals that show evidence of disease, uncontrollable behavior, or uncleanliness.

CATTLE HEALTH RULES

1. Cattle from other states shall be accompanied by a certificate issued by a qualified veterinarian either showing record of negative tuberculin test conducted within 30 days of date of shipment from the home ranch or by a veterinarian's signed statement that the animals originated in herds which are free from tuberculosis. The Livestock Sanitary Officials from the state of origin can issue the signed statement.
2. Cattle from within California - No cattle originating within the State of California shall be admitted or remain on the fairgrounds that originate from an infected herd. An infected herd is one so classified by the Federal and State Department of Agriculture. After the entry forms are received, they will be checked with the State list to determine whether or not they meet the tuberculosis requirements.
3. BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS: All female animals over four months and not over twelve months of age will be vaccinated for Brucellosis before leaving fairgrounds at the conclusion of the fair unless:
 - a) they have already been vaccinated and have the owners' signature on Form 74-043 or veterinarians' statement as to the vaccination, or
 - b) they are consigned to a meat processor.

SWINE HEALTH RULES

1. All swine must originate in validated Brucellosis-free herds or areas. California is a validated state. Out-of-state swine must be accompanied by an official health certificate confirming validated status of the herd or area of origin; and that the swine have met the federal pseudo-rabies interstate movement requirements.

SHEEP HEALTH RULES

1. All sheep must have scrapie ID tag to be eligible to exhibit.
2. Sheep from other states must meet the importation requirements of the California Department of Agriculture.

GOAT HEALTH RULES

1. All goats (breeding and market) must have scrapie ID tag. To be eligible to exhibit, dairy goats from other states must be accompanied by an official certificate showing:
 - a) A statement by a veterinarian that Brucellosis is not prevalent among dairy goats in the area, or;
 - b) Negative Brucellosis test within 30 days prior to entry.

CODE OF ETHICS

It has become necessary for fairs throughout the state and the nation to adopt a Code of Ethics to maintain a positive reputation and to ensure that good animal husbandry is on display for all spectators. The Executive Committee of the Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair (ESDCJF) believes that by adopting a Code of Ethics, we will promote a positive example of the advantages of following accepted animal husbandry practices. We hope that these guidelines will allow us to maintain an educational and competitive atmosphere while presenting a high-quality show for all exhibitors and the public. It is the hope and desire of the Fair Board that all exhibitors are being instructed in accepted animal husbandry practices. We feel that the following Code of Ethics will help to prevent the disastrous stories we hear which have taken place at other shows. **By submitting your entries, you agree to these terms:**

1. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor, parents, and leaders/advisors to read, understand, and comply with the written rules of the ESDCJF.
2. All exhibits must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor for the required days to exhibit at ESDCJF.
3. Breeding animals must be entered in the appropriate class for their age group.
4. Physical alteration including treatment of the animal internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or other substance to artificially improve the conformation; or surgery or insertion of foreign matter under the skin or into body cavities, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body or the physical abuse of the animal is strictly prohibited.
5. All exhibitors must **TRAIN, FIT AND SHOW THEIR OWN** animals.
6. All exhibitors, parents, and leaders/advisors should conduct themselves in a manner to avoid criticizing, or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or on the fair grounds.

SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION RULES

SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

1. All livestock exhibitors are eligible to be entered in showmanship classes. There is no entry fee for showmanship with the exception of dogs.
2. Only animals in place on the fairgrounds since Sunday move-in that are owned, fitted, and shown by the exhibitor are eligible. This does not apply to one day shows.
3. Exhibitors shall be on hand and ready to exhibit at the time called for judging immediately before or following judging of classes within that division.

2. If an exhibitor wins more than one showmanship, they will represent the division that they first win.

SELECTION OF EXHIBITORS FOR SMALL ANIMAL ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP

1. The first-place winner in each division showmanship of small animals, (rabbit, cavy, Pygmy goat, and dog) and each showmanship class including Junior, Intermediate, Senior, and Senior Novice are eligible for round robin.
2. If an exhibitor wins more than one showmanship, they will represent the division that they first win.
3. In the event that one exhibitor wins more than one class of showmanship, the second-place exhibitor will then represent that division.
4. Round robin participants will show rabbits, covies, Pygmy goats, and dogs.
5. The winners shall bring the animal, which they won their Division with to use in Round Robin.

If without merit, the Judge shall make no award. The rules in the judging section in this Entry Book apply to Home Arts.
6. Junior and Senior high point winners – High point winners are calculated by adding points from exhibitors entering 4 or more divisions and earning at least 1 blue ribbon in a minimum of 4 divisions and at least 1 Grand, Reserve or Special award. Total points are calculated based on 2 points per each blue ribbon, 3 points per each Special award, 4 points per each Reserve Champion award and 5 points per each Grand Champion award. High point winners receive a \$50 cash award and a trophy.
7. Group entries will not be included in high point calculations. One member of each group must submit the entry. Please list the rest of the group member names with the description of your project.
